Here at St. Patrick's we have a very active School Council. The School Council takes part in lots of activities including:

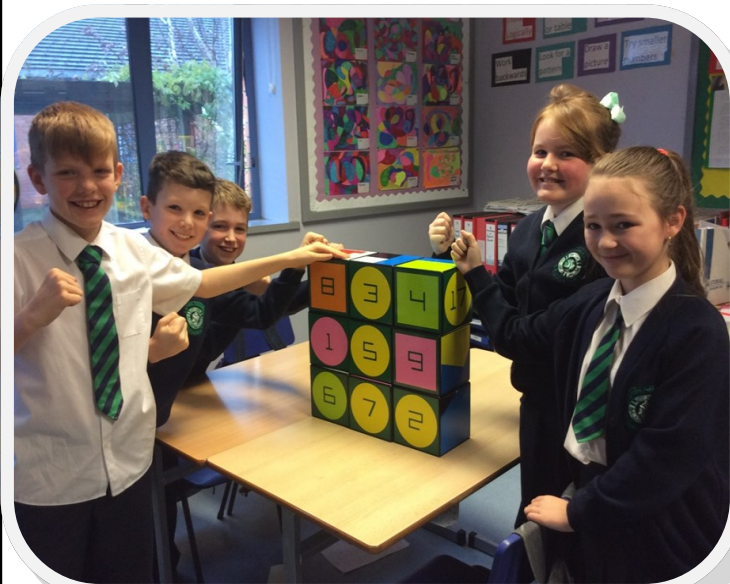
- Coming up with ideas to help improve the school and making decisions

New Mathematics Initiatives in St Patrick's

We have introduced a new maths resource, called IZAK9, into the school for P5, P6 and P7 classes. Izak9 is an innovative Mathematics resource from Qubizm. The resource appeals to the engagement of pupils through active learning in groups. We have been selected to participate in the trial of this resource and have acquired two of these for our participation. Our Mathematics co-ordinator, Mrs Moore, has been uploading lessons which are relevant to our P.6 children, onto the Izak9 site. For example the P.6 teachers have been working on divisibility tests to assist with the learning of prime numbers and Mrs Moore has uploaded a lesson on this for use with Izak9. Other teachers have uploaded lessons also. Children in Mrs Moore's class in Primary 6 were the first to use the resource and they had an enjoyable and challenging afternoon working in teams to solve a maths problem.



Athletics Success at St Patrick's

St Patrick's Athletics' Club took part in St Mary's Duathlon (run- cycle-run) on 29th November 2018. This was the third year of this fantastic event. St Mary's provided bikes, helmets and fantastic encouragement from the girls from their Triathlon Club. Our athletes were fabulous competitors, with many competing in their first ever duathlon.
